Maths Olympiad Round 1 Result

South African Maths Olympiad Round 1 Results

All boys who take Mathematics wrote Round 1 of the South African Maths Olympiad last week. About 82 000 learners from 1023 schools across the country write Round 1 and less than 20% advance to Round 2. To qualify for Round 2 a student must achieve 50% or more for Round 1.

Grade 8 and 9 write separate junior papers, whilst Grade 10 to 12 writes the same senior paper. The senior paper is therefore tough for Grade 10 students.

The Maths Department is pleased to announce that 49% of boys at Bishops qualify for Round 2. Broken down into Grades the percentages are:

Grade 8: 65%, Grade 9 42%; Grade 10: 31%, Grade 11 52% and Grade 12 57%

Well done to all those who got through. Round 2 will be written on Tuesday 13th May.
