Science Achievements

The Top 3 will receive R25 000 and those ranked 4 to 15 receive cash or book prizes, and we'll be keeping our fingers crossed for Nic and Rahul to end up in that Top 3. All candidates ranked 1 to 50 receive one year's free tuition from Rhodes University, subject to meeting the University's entry requirements. Well done to Nic and Rahul.

The 2014 UCT Maths Competition had 6932 entries from 152 schools. A maximum of 75 students from one school may enter the competition.

The overall result for each school is based on the scores of the top 30 students.

In the 35 years that the competition has been held at UCT, Bishops, Rondebosch Boys' High and Westerford have occupied the top 3 positions.

This year Rondebosch Boys' High won the competition after a 7 year winning streak by Bishops. Bishops came 2nd and Westerford 3rd.

The Prize Giving for Gold Award winners – top ten individuals and top 3 pairs was held on 14th May.

Bishops had 2 pairs and 7 individuals receive Gold Awards.

In Grade 9 Nicholas Featherstone came 4th.

In Grade 11 Soo-Min Lee came 1st, Christian Cotchobos 4th and Michael Thomson 10th.

In Grade 12 Daniel Mesham came 3rd, Murray McKechnie 6th and Tom Orton 10th.

In the pairs section in Grade 11, Stefan Dominicus and Jonti Oehley came 2nd while Matthew Kuttel and Joshua Knipe came 3rd.

- In the Junior section Senne Ramiah played very steady golf well suited to the Links style of the 27 hole layout and he finished 18th in his section with 66 points.
- Ameer Tyer partnered him in the better-ball format to finish 37th.

Overall Bishops ended up 13th out of 25 schools in the team format and it was great to see our golfers competing with the most talented girls and boys in the country.
